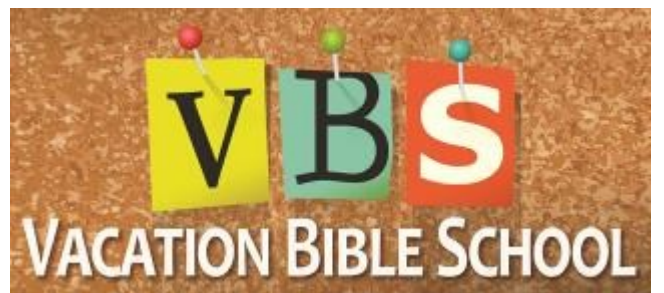

# FROM THE PASTOR

One thing that stands out about Luther's beloved German Mass (*Deutsche Messe und Ordnung des Gottesdiensts*), published in 1526, is that Luther sought to produce neither a mass nor a rite, but rather to rid the reader of the need for such a specific playbook, for which his audience continued to request of him.

Luther continued to impress upon his reader that the important part of the order of worship was not the "what," but the "why." Whatever you wear, keep it simple, he says. Wherever you do it, make sure you can hear clearly and without distraction. Whatever you sing, make sure it is Christ-centered. Whatever you say, just make clear the Word, scripture, Christ, and forgiveness. All the rest, he implies in many ways, is simply window dressing. Luther's German Mass helps keep our eyes focused on the reason why we gather for worship; Christ alone. (We have Luther's Works in the library by the elevator, feel free to take a look!)

In an era when tradition, rites, and church polity overshadowed the message of the gospel, Luther rightly expressed that faithful worship is less about the "what," and more about the "why." The same is true as we worship the Lord with our tithes and offerings. Through the sale of indulgences, the selfishness of the medieval church took from its people what should've been a pure offering, and used it for selfish gain at the expense of the common man.

By calling out the sinful practice of indulgences, the Holy Spirit through Luther set the offering free. Today, we give, but not in order to attain salvation nor satisfy the greed of corrupt leadership. Rather, we give out of grateful response to what has already been given. The offering was set free! Like the German Mass, neither the pomp nor the grandeur mean anything, but the "why," for we are set free in Christ!

Coercion to give still exists today, and we can see it around us. Some say, "Give, in order that the Lord will reward you," or "If you do not give, your heart must not be right." Coercion by guilt or reward would place our worshipful offerings back into the same prison from which they were once set free. But, in Christ, we are set free from mankind's hidden agendas so we may freely and rightly worship the Lord with our tithes and offerings (2 Cor 9:6-7). Luther realized and articulated this!

Conversely, there is a real risk to give out of an expectation to receive something in return. If, when we give, we have expectations of what the church is going to "do for me" because of what we have given to it, then we have fallen prey to a kind of transactional reciprocity, as if the church now owes us something. The offering is again at risk, this time of becoming not an offering, but rather an investment (there is nothing wrong with an investment, but an offering is something entirely different).

An offering marked by selfishness, whether by the medieval agenda or modern investment; both are at risk of becoming not an offering at all. If we give it to God, then it is His to direct. We gave because of what He has already done for us, out of response for what we have already received, not because we expect to be rewarded for our actions.

So where does that leave us? We give freely. We give out of joy. We expect nothing in return, for we have already received all we could ever hope for. We ask the Holy Spirit to purify our hearts as we do. That is a pure, worshipful offering, fitting for our Lord.
