# FROM THE PASTOR



Happy Birthday, Immanuel! How does it feel to be 180 years old? Celebrating birthdays or special anniversaries gives one the opportunity to reflect on the past year or years and recognize God's gracious blessings in one's life. While not one of those anniversaries that advances by quarter century increments....150, 175, etc., a 180th Anniversary of Immanuel's beginning, marking our birthday as a congregation, is a wonderful opportunity to consider all of God's blessings.

On June 9, 1844, 20 families established their own church on Old Bonhomme (now Warson Road). "On this God's Little Acre" a church, school, parsonage and a cemetery were built. Interestingly, it would be 22 years before the name "Immanuel" would be officially accepted; prior to that people knew the congregation as "The Evangelical Congregation U.A.C. (Unaltered Augsburg Confession) on the Bonhomme Road." Around 1880, the present church and school property was purchased (for \$300); a new brick church would be built (1883); and a new school building (1905). These would be replaced by the present stone church and the school buildings you see today, as well as expanded with the addition of the East Building property. As interesting as all the changes might be, ministry is more than properties and structures.

From the very beginning, Immanuel's ministry has been about sharing Jesus with people; sharing the good news that "we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus." For 180 years, that grace of God has been at the heart of ministry for Immanuel, through our church, school and (for the last 24 years) Light of Christ Chinese Ministry.

How do you account for all of the blessings that God has so graciously showered upon Immanuel as a church, school and Chinese mission? It is impossible. For how do you account for the effect of God's Word taught and proclaimed in services throughout 180 years? How do you consider all of the new creations in Christ brought up out of the waters of Holy Baptism in the past 180 years? How many have kneeled at the Lord's Table and with out stretched hands, received Christ's body and blood, given and shed for the forgiveness of their sin? How many over those years came to faith because someone invited, "Come and see"? It would be impossible to make a record of blessings; all we can do is sing, "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow" and trust that God in His faithfulness will continue to bring blessings through His Word and Sacraments for another 180 years and beyond!

April 14 was a day of great joy for Light of Christ Church, as three new brothers and sisters joined the family of Christ through baptism: Sister Pan Yu, Brother Liao Fuyi, and his son Ivan.



Sister Pan Yu has been coming to Light of Christ for over a decade. She joined the computer class at the center and came to church gatherings occasionally but remained hesitant to accept the Lord due to her background in Buddhism. Thanks to the continuous work of the Holy Spirit, she finally opened her heart, abandoned her former belief and accepted Jesus Christ as her Savior. Truly, God works in mysterious ways!

Brother Liao Fuyi, since moving to the United States, first encountered Christianity when he saw the powerful impact of the Christian faith in the life of his co-worker. In wanting to know more, he started attending services at Light of Christ in 2021, listening to the sermons, actively participating in various groups and fellowships, and interacting with many brothers and sisters who provided him with much help and guidance. In his testimony, he said,

"Thank God, over the past two years, I have gained a deeper understanding of the Christian faith, leading to profound changes in my life. Previously, I often quarreled with my wife, which hurt my family, but now, whenever I feel angry, I think of God's words – 'Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. ...Love bears all things, hopes all things, endures all things.' (1 Cor 13:4-7), and think of my own sins, and the Holy Spirit would help me to calm down. From the first time I hugged my daughter before she went to school, to admitting my mistakes and asking for forgiveness in front of my daughter, to my son becoming confident and cheerful, all of these I could not have done without the help of the Lord."

Fuyi also mentioned his expectations for his children, saying, "I remember the joyful scene when celebrating my daughter's one-month birthday more than ten years ago. At that time, I was full of expectations, wanting to provide the best for my daughter, looking forward to her growing up, getting married with happiness. However, the reality is that all these are worldly vanities, temporary. Only knowing and trusting in God can bring true and eternal joy. Therefore, I will continue to pray for my family, hoping they will turn their hearts to the Lord!"



Fuyi's wife and daughter have not yet accepted Christ, but they often attend church. Let us continue to pray for them, that the Holy Spirit will continue to work in them to receive

the gift of salvation so that the whole family can worship the Lord together and become a blessed family. Let us also continue to pray for Fuyi and his son, that God will strengthen their faith, and lead them in spiritual growth, as Fuyi himself expressed,

"Today, I am baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, praying that the Lord, through the work of the Holy Spirit, will help me live out this new life to become the light and salt of the world, and proclaim the love of God. May the grace of the Lord strengthen me until eternity! Amen!"


