WORSHIP CHANGES:

Beginning Sunday, May 1st, whenever the body and blood of Christ are offered in the sacrament of Holy Communion, we will include the option to receive Christ's blood not only by the individual cups as we have been doing, but also the common cup, or "chalice" will be available. When consecrated and received in the celebration of communion, both the chalice and the individual cups equally contain the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. The individual cups often serve as a reminder that Christ comes directly to each one of us, providing forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation as He cares for each person individually. The chalice often serves as a reminder that we are united together as the one body of Christ not only with those at this table, but also throughout the world and for all time.

Additionally, after much prayer and with approval of the board Elders, our pastors will no longer be wearing masks during the rite of the Lord's Supper. We do so, knowing that God's Word, presence, and forgiveness are declared and heard clearly by the ears that hear the words, and also seen by the eyes what is spoken from the mouth.

Also beginning next weekend, the seating restrictions will be removed. Today's 10:30am Confirmation service will not have any seating restrictions in an effort to accommodate everyone.
