Worship Notes

10th Sunday after Pentecost – August 14, 2022

*We welcome our members and guests who are worshiping with us today,
and pray God's rich blessings upon you during this time of worship!*

THEME

Deceptive prophecies are wicked. God will execute judgment on those whose counsels mitigate God's Word! The refrain for the covenant people of God is faith! They wholeheartedly believe exactly what the Lord says and count on His deliverance generation after generation. Jesus desires to reveal not only judgment, but also grace through His cross. Faith alone comprehends the impact of Law and Gospel. Faith clings to Christ and repels all wickedness and deceit.

ORDER

This morning we follow a hymn-based setting of one of the traditional *Orders of the Day* of the early Church, the *Order of Matins*, or "of the morning." Our Te Deum hymn is one often associated with the Trinity, but it is actually a hymn paraphrase of the traditional text of the Te Deum, with additional stanzas that aren't normally sung unless it is used in this manner.

HYMN OF THE DAY

The hymn, *Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word*, by Dr. Martin Luther may first have appeared in broadsheet form in Wittenberg, Germany in 1542. The occasion for the hymn is believed to be attributable to the difficult times for the Empire in their battle with the Mohammedan Turks. In his letter to the pastors in the Wittenberg area, Luther urged devout prayers after the sermon and he frequently stressed the importance of prayers by the children. Such were the conditions which prompted this hymn, which is a prayer, and which has probably enjoyed the widest use of all his hymns throughout the years. The tune also comes from Wittenberg and is believed to have been written specifically for this text. Some have attributed the tune to Dr. Luther, too, but this is little more than conjecture.

Epistle

Hebrews 11:17-31, 12:1-3

“Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us.”

¹⁷By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of offering up his only son, ¹⁸of whom it was said, “Through Isaac shall your offspring be named.” ¹⁹He considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead, from which, figuratively speaking, he did receive him back. ²⁰By faith Isaac invoked future blessings on Jacob and Esau. ²¹By faith Jacob, when dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, bowing in worship over the head of his staff. ²²By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, made mention of the exodus of the Israelites and gave directions concerning his bones.

²³By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw that the child was beautiful, and they were not afraid of the king’s edict. ²⁴By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh’s daughter, ²⁵choosing rather to be mistreated with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward. ²⁷By faith he left Egypt, not being afraid of the anger of the king, for he endured as seeing him who is invisible. ²⁸By faith he kept the Passover and sprinkled the blood, so that the Destroyer of the firstborn might not touch them.

²⁹By faith the people crossed the Red Sea as if on dry land, but the Egyptians, when they attempted to do the same, were drowned. ³⁰By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had given a friendly welcome to the spies.

¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

³Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted.
