

Worship Notes Mission Observance – September 28, 2025

We welcome our members and guests who are worshiping with us today, and pray God's rich blessings upon you during this time of worship!

THEME

In His great commission, Jesus said, "All authority on heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." God tells us to go, too, and we often reply, "No." We think we're the wrong person, or not gifted enough, not old enough (or too old). But God tells us "Go" and that He will be with us. And because we do dare to believe those incredible words, we are here today to risk asking our Lord to send us as He was sent and as He sent His first disciples.

ORDER:

Today we follow a special order of worship of reading and music centered around the mission of the Church to go and reach all nations ... whether near or far!

HYMN OF THE DAY

Our *Hymn of the Day* this weekend is a song that many of us learned as little children in Sunday School or Vacation Bible School, *I Love to Tell the Story*. The text was written by Arabella Katherine Hankey (1834-1911). Early in life she became involved in religious work. As a young girl she taught Sunday School, and at 18 organized a Bible study for girls working in factories in London. When her brother fell ill in Africa, she traveled there to bring him home, and that trip sparked a passion for foreign mission work. When she turned 30 she fell ill, and was confined to bed rest for almost a year. During that time she wrote a poem, "The Old, Old Story" of 100 stanzas! The following year, parts were quoted at the convention of the YMCA, and songwriter William Doane put a portion of her poem to music, giving birth to the hymn. The tune by William Fischer is named HANKEY in her honor!



- **■** In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- L If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.
- Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.

Luther's Morning Prayer




