# FROM THE PASTOR

## Stewards of God's Gift of Time

### Could you consider giving just 1% of your time?

Time is precious. By the time we crawl out of bed each day, our "time indicator" is reading somewhere between 72-80% remaining. Each day we are gifted a precious 1,440 minutes to use. In round numbers, every 15 minutes that ticks by is 1% of your day. Even now I can hear the rhythm of our wall clock ticking away as each minute slips into the past and just like that there goes another 1% of the day.



For people who often measure our days in hours, it can be a different concept to think about 1%; yet in our various calendar planning tools, time is already broken into 15-minute increments. So how do you use the allotment of time you are given each day? I know personally, after my alarm goes off and I am still too lazy to get out of bed, I can spend 1-2% of my time checking emails, texts and scrolling social media. Once my feet hit the floor, it's another 3-5% getting ready, eating breakfast, etc. before I am out the door for the day. On an average day I spend 34% of my time at work, and 24-28% spent sleeping. Now if you are keeping track, I still have about 31% of time left...this is time for me, for my wife,

for my family, for my grandkids; time used to live the life we live when we are not sleeping or working.

When my cellphone gets to 31% battery life, I start to think about recharging, but our time each day just keeps ticking along until the start of a new one brings us back to 100%. It would certainly be telling if our lives came with an automatic warning, "low on time" feature, or a visual indicator of percentage of time remaining each day. On especially busy and hectic days, we would watch the percentage continue to decrease, while our blood pressure and anxiety are on the increase. Imagine if we had that sort of indicator for the minutes remaining of each day? At what point might you start to panic?

Now my point is not to scare you or stress you out, but to get you to think differently about the gift of each day's time. **Each day, God is giving you 100 units of time;** time meant for rest and working (God's providing your daily needs) and time to live life with those God has placed around you. And since God is the One who created and graciously grants you the gift of time, do you think for 2024 we might **consider giving Him just one of those units for daily prayer and Bible reading, along with the time we already spend in worship?** Just 1%, 15 minutes of the 1,440 precious minutes the Lord gives you each day. Each day begins with 100%; how will you spend your day, as a steward of God's gift of time?

As many of you know, we are going through the accreditation process. The validation team will visit us mid-April to observe and learn about our school. Our teachers and staff have been working hard to prepare for their visit.

The accreditation process takes place every five years. In between those years, goals are made for schools to continue to showcase their successes and make improvements that demonstrate our identity in Christ, educational excellence, continuing improvement, and innovation.

Our teachers formed committees of additional staff, parents, and church members to investigate, evaluate and complete a self-study of each of the seven standards in the report. These standards range from our relationships between church and school, school and families, and school and community, to studying our curriculum and religion lessons in each grade, our facilities, student services, and so on. The evidence collected for each standard is extensive. This process helps us accomplish staying true to our mission, purpose, vision and values as a Lutheran and Christ-centered school and church. It also guides us as we look for ways to make improvements to provide a high quality education.

Believe it or not, our students play a large role in our process as well! We are thankful for them sharing their thoughts through surveys and conversations we have had throughout the year. As leaders of the next generation, I welcome their insights and ideas, allowing them to share their voices.

Though each accreditation year can be challenging and time consuming, it is a wonderful thing! I cannot think of a better way to share what we do, and thank our teachers and staff, our church and family communities, for the job well done. The service they provide and support is invaluable. I ask for your continued prayers as we finalize our self-study accreditation report, and anticipate and prepare for the validation team to visit!

## NEW FORMAT FOR THE SOULARD SHELTER

For the last 15 years, our Immanuel family has been preparing and serving dinner on the first Monday evening each month to 60 men housed at Sts. Peter and Paul Shelter in Soulard. Up to now, the Shelter was only open for dinner and an overnight stay....the men had to leave the Shelter by 7 am each day and could return for dinner and sleeping over. To better serve the community, the Shelter is now open 24/7, which means breakfast and lunch are now served in addition to dinner.

This new format gives us the opportunity to change up our serving schedule. We'll still serve dinner in February and March. However, beginning Wednesday, April 3, we'll begin preparing and serving **LUNCH** to our friends housed at the Shelter on the **FIRST WEDNESDAY EACH MONTH**. We think this new plan will be better for several reasons. We'll only be serving lunch to 30-40 men, and we'll be serving the meal during the day. We're hoping the new schedule will work well for our volunteers who prepare, deliver, and serve the meals.

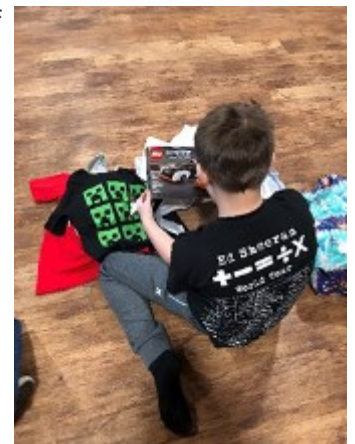
## CHRISTMAS GIFT COLLECTION RECAP
