Worship Notes 15th Sunday after Pentecost – September 18, 2022

We welcome our members and guests who are worshiping with us today, and pray God's rich blessings upon you during this time of worship!

THEME

Faithful stewards of God's gifts anchor themselves in constant prayer, intercession, and thanksgiving. Meager gifts of the poor ought to be intentionally safeguarded; the position and wealth of kings are to be highly regarded. Yet we know wealth belongs to a fallen world. Obsession with riches threatens our loyalty to God. Christ surpasses the value of all material possessions. He is our lasting treasure who paid the greatest price – ransoming our lives at the cost of His own.

ORDER

This morning we follow Setting Three of the Divine Service. This setting comes from *The Lutheran Hymnal* from 1941, and was the first widely used English liturgy in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. It came to the LCMS from the English Synod at the time that church body became a part of the LCMS.

HYMN OF THE DAY

The text to the hymn, *Seek Where You May to Find a Way*, was written by Georg Weissel in 1623 for his installation as pastor in Königsberg on the Third Sunday in Advent. Today this hymn is more generally sung as a faith and justification hymn than as one for Advent! This hymn, as well as his other Advent hymn, *Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates,* stand as true masterpieces of German hymnody! The tune was composed by Johann Stobäss, a friend of Weissel, for another text in 1613 and then paired with this text.

The Lord's Supper

In preparation for reception of the Lord's Supper (*Holy Communion*), it is important that we review and understand what the Bible, and therefore the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, teaches regarding this sacrament:

The Bible teaches that Jesus gives us His very body and blood along with bread and wine in Holy Communion¹, and that these are means by which He forgives our sins², strengthens us for daily living, and draws us into closer fellowship with Him and other believers. The Bible also teaches us to examine ourselves prior to receiving the meal³. For those receiving Holy Communion, examine yourself with these questions:

Do I believe that I am a sinner and am I sorry for my sins?

Do I believe that Jesus Christ is God's Son and my personal Savior?

Do I believe that Christ's true body and blood are present in this holy meal for my forgiveness?


Do I truly intend with the help of God to correct my sinful life?

According to Christ's Word in the Holy Scriptures, and in confession with the true Christian faith, at Immanuel we observe the practice of **close communion**. We believe that all who commune must confess the same holy faith, as Holy Scripture teaches. Since one's church affiliation indicates an individual's confession of faith, we ask that only those who have been instructed in the above teaching and are **confirmed members of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod** commune. If you have not been instructed in this teaching on Holy Communion, are in doubt, or hold a different confession of faith⁴, you are still welcome to come forward and cross your arms to indicate that you would like a blessing.




Confession of Sins and Absolution

- P Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.




¹[Jesus] also said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was wasting his possessions.


The Nicene Creed



Prayer of the Church



- C Amen.



Lord's Prayer


- L Lord, remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray:

This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."




